Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a great first wellbeing week of the year this week. It was fantastic to see the children and staff all wearing yellow yesterday to support the Hello Yellow campaign for Young Minds. Safeguarding alert for book series

We have been made aware of a safeguarding alert about a children's book series 'Spy Dogs/Pup'and the 'Spy Cat' books written by Andrew Cope. These books contain a link to a website which contains highly pornographic content. The book asks children to explore the website to find out more about characters. It appears that the website (identified on the back or inside page) has been compromised and takes users to a pornographic website with no age verification. All schools nationally are removing these books. Please can we ask you to check at home to see if you have any of these books and remove them accordingly. Please get in touch if you have any questions.

OPAL

Mr Jeffreys was busy over the summer holidays clearing the area which will be our new sandpit, pond and digging zone. All the wonderful donations which were given last term are stored away ready for when it can be opened. I do have a request for any junk model making items, no sharp cans or anything the children can't easily stick with masking tape please. Any donations can be brought into school in a bag labeled OPAL. We also need any folding pushchairs that are not needed anymore as the children love pushing them around the playground, again any donations can be handed into reception, please label them OPAL.

Before and after school arrangements reminder

- Please ensure children are not using the climbing ship or field before or after school.
- At 8.50am, staff will be available to meet and greet the children as they arrive. Please only pass on *urgent* messages to staff during this time. Any other messages should be communicated to admin or via class email addresses.
- If pick up arrangements are different from usual, this should be communicated to the school office and not class email addresses as these may not be checked until after the school day finishes.

Children should be collected promptly at 3.30pm. In an extenuating circumstance which will result
in you collecting your child later than this, please communicate this with the school office as soon
as possible. You may be charged if your child is put into after school club but there is no guarantee
of available space. If you are late collecting your child on a regular basis, you will be contacted by a
member of the Senior Leadership team to discuss this.

Children should **not** arrive on the premises <u>before 8.40am</u>. In EYFS and KS1 classes, children should line up sensibly on the front playground and wait for their class teacher to collect them. KS2 children should wait sensibly outside their classroom until the school opens. The doors open at 8.50am, and will close at 8.55am, after this the children must be signed in at the office.

To protect the wellbeing of all children, we may need to review access to the playground if parents and children continue to arrive earlier than 8.40am.
