Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy week this week here at Littletown and this is set to continue as we enter the build up to the Christmas period. I know that sometimes there can be lots of emails and school admin to keep on top of. I appreciate your understanding of this and as a Littletown parent myself, I have to try and keep on top of it all too! I do believe a busy school is a sign of a good school and strong community though, so it is really positive that there is always so much going on to tell you about and keep on top of!

This week we have marked National Road safety week and the children have learnt about this in assemblies. To accompany this and as a timely reminder as the winter nights draw in and mornings and evenings get darker, please see start and end of day arrangements reminder attached to this newsletter for your information. Today in assembly we continued our series on British Values by focussing on the Rule of Law and how this links to school rules and values. I also had the pleasure of presenting certificates and the winners trophy to the children who won the Honiton Learning Community Sportshall Athletics event last Friday!

Also this week, Year 4 enjoyed their outdoor classroom on Tuesday where they made landscape art using the Autumn leaves and in the afternoon some of our children took part in the next round of the Bee Netball. Wednesday morning we welcomed Parental Minds to our Community Room for a session that was greatly valued by all the parents who attended. We will host them again soon. On Tuesday and Wednesday, our Year 6 classes visited Honiton Community College for a Science workshop. Yesterday, Year 1 enjoyed their outdoor classroom where they produced outdoor den structures. Yesterday we also welcomed children and staff from Offwell and Upottery schools to Littletown to join Mrs Davis and our Mental Health Ambassadors for training from Normal Magic. This included an assembly enjoyed by Littletown children and an excellent presentation to parents. My thanks to Mrs Davis for organising this event.

Next week is another very busy and exciting week for the children. On Tuesday, we welcome the Space Dome to the school hall for Year 5 and Year 6 children to experience as part of the curriculum. We also have the Aladdin pantomime on Thursday morning for the children to enjoy in our school hall. On Thursday afternoon we have multiple sporting events with some Year 5 and 6 children representing the school in the annual Exeter City football tournament and some Year 5 and 6 children taking part in an event at Honiton Bowls Club. On Friday, Year 2 visit Honiton Leisure Centre for their Multi Skills event.

Next Thursday we are excited to welcome M and M Theatricals to perform a pantomime for the children. This has been funded by the PTFA. It is a great example of a lovely experience for the children that we couldn't provide from school funds or ask parents to pay for and is why a successful PTFA is so crucial to the life of a school. You will be aware that next Saturday we have our PTFA Christmas Fayre and we are really struggling for enough help for this event. Term dates 2024-25

As you know, this year we did not have a two week half term in October and we look forward to having a two week half term in May. Since we made this change, Honiton Community College has joined Ted Wragg Multi Academy Trust and re-established their two week half term in October. A significant part of the rationale for our two week half term initially, alongside giving parents the chance to take a holiday avoiding higher holiday week costs, was to synchronise with the Secondary school to support the many families with pupils in each setting. Therefore, the Governors have taken the decision to again match Honiton Community College and re-establish our two week half term in October. We have had to wait until the College published these dates in order to publish ours to ensure they match. You will see that this means the Autumn Term next year will consist of an 8 week half term and a 6 week half term. We would have chosen to create two half terms of 7 weeks instead, but this would not have matched the extra week chosen by the College. We hope to engage in earlier dialogue with the college regarding future October half terms.

I appreciate your patience and understanding in waiting longer than usual for us to publish these dates as a result of the process above. I also understand the possible frustration with us moving to May this year only to move back again the following year. I can only apologise for this. We will always try to do the best thing for Littletown families with the information we have at the point of making decisions.
