## **Children's news**

### **Nursery**

In nursery we have been making Gruffalo crumble and have drawn our favourite part of it too!

### **Reception**

In Science we have been making rocket launchers with straws looking at leaves and making solar system pictures. In Maths we are looking at the number 8.

### **Year 1**

In DT we have been learning about and making wheels, chassis and axles and designing our own vehicles.

### **Year 2**

In Art we have been using string to make texture and in Geography we have been learning about compass directions in the UK.

### **Year 3**

In Year 3 they have been to Kents Cavern today and they have been doing Friday experimenting with Newton meters. They have also been learning about the stone age.

## **January Safeguarding Update**

### **Social Media**

Many of our pupils have returned from the Christmas holidays excitedly telling their teachers and friends about their new Xboxes, iPads and mobile phones. The vast majority have chatted about the security settings their parents have enabled too, which is fantastic to hear.

With the recent ban in Australia of under 16 using social media in Australia and the UK launching a consultation this week to pass the same law, aimed at keeping young people safe online, we continue to educate the children and consistently remind them of the present age restrictions for apps and platforms which we know some of the children access. (Please follow the NSPCC link below to remind yourselves of age restrictions and social media top tips for parents).

In the UK, the Online Safety Act sets out the standards for social media platforms such as Facebook, YouTube and TikTok.

New rules under the act came into force from 25 July 2025 to protect under 18s from harmful online content on social media, including hate speech and violence. They are also aimed at preventing children from accessing pornography or content which encourages self-harm, suicide or eating disorders.

Methods like facial scans, photo ID and credit card checks are being used to check the age of users. However, outside of this, there isn't a set age limit on the use of social media, but the UK Government has launched a consultation on bringing in social media ban for under 16s.
