School Dinner Price Increase

'Following discussion at the Board of Governors meeting on Tuesday I inform you that school meal prices will be increasing from £2.60 to £2.85 from after the May half term. Over the last few years the school has been making a loss of 25p per meal and the school budget can no longer support this anymore. Please note, this is not related to the recent change from Fresha to Caterlink as Caterlink agreed to match costs from the Fresha contract. Many thanks for your understanding.
