Dear Parents and Carers,

In assembly this afternoon I shared with the children that we have received the news that Littletown is now awarded the Silver Rights Respecting Schools Award. This is testimony to all the hard work of the children and particularly, Mrs Luxton and Mrs Arni who have led this through the school. Although focussing on the United Nations Rights of the Child articles as a framework and the hard work of our rights ambassadors, the assessment celebrated many facets of the school ranging from curriculum, assemblies, values, pupil voice, OPAL, behaviour approaches, inclusion and many others. I am really proud of the school for this accomplishment and we now begin working towards the rarely obtained Gold standard.

Earlier on today, we welcomed PCSO England and PC Dell, Youth Engagement Officer to speak to Year 5 and 6 children about all the things they need to be mindful of in their conduct as they grow older. This was very useful and we were all impressed with the maturity shown by the children.

Also this week, on Monday, Reception children enjoyed visiting the Space Dome. On Wednesday we had visitors from Axminster Primary School who were really impressed with the OPAL lunchtime they observed.

Next week, on Tuesday, Year 4 have outdoor classroom and Year 5 and Year 2 have a visit from the Fire safety education team. On Thursday some of our Year 5 and 6 children represent the school in the annual Exeter City football tournament and some KS2 children take part in a bowling workshop at Honiton Bowling club. On Friday, Year 3 visit Kent's Cavern and some Year 5 and 6 take part in boys Futsal at Honiton Leisure Centre. We also welcome visits from Ruth Miskin Training and Cornerstone English Hub as we continue to develop Read Write Inc in the school.

Finally, I look forward to seeing lots of the children at the school discos this evening. My thanks again to the PTFA for putting these on for the children.
