A huge thank you to our amazing Digitals Leaders for leading 2 assemblies this week, prior to Internet Safety day next Tuesday. The theme this year is:

'Smart tech, safe choices – Exploring the safe and responsible use of AI'.

Everyone's talking about AI, and with many children and young people hearing about and using AI online, it's important they have the skills and confidence to make safe choices when they are using smart technology. This Safer Internet Day we are exploring the impact of AI on all of our lives, looking at how AI can be used for good, and giving advice and guidance that empowers people to use AI safely and responsibly. (Uk Safer internet Centre) Presently, our AI school policy restricts the use of AI by pupils due to most AI tools being restricted to age18+. However, we are aware of pupils accessing AI outside of school so believe it is important to educate children around the safe use of AI. We also anticipate policy and guidance changing soon to keep pace with this emerging technology.
