School Sports Grant 2016/17

At Littletown we aim to give every child the confidence to enjoy participating in a variety of different sports and have the opportunity to take part in competitive games against other schools.

Continuing professional development (CPD).

To date all year groups have had CPD through at least two cycles (over the last 4 years). New sports (such as Tchoukball) and the use of different equipment (large wall bars) have also been introduced to our sports curriculum. Feedback from our teachers has been extremely positive. This year CPD focused on supporting Newly Qualified Teachers in our school.

Interventions

There were 125 spaces for children to take part in our PE intervention programs during this academic year. These sessions were aimed at boosting children's confidence and ability in PE, and also giving children who don't attend out of school sports clubs a chance to take part in extra PE. This means that every child in our school has had experienced extra sports sessions in addition to the two hours of PE curriculum time. Teachers have also developed their use of these sessions, targeting children's skills where appropriate by flexible grouping (when a child improves they are replaced with another child). Teachers also noted an increased confidence, attitude and ability in these children when delivering class PE.

Clubs

There were 40 places in extra sports clubs every week during this year run by Go Active. In addition, there was an invitational gymnastics club and a TAG rugby club which lead to competitions in those sports. This is over 2500 extra-curricular sessions delivered to our children across the three terms. Our Year 5/6 children also had opportunities to compete against other local schools in netball and rounders in after school competitions.

Swimming

During this year, all of KS2, KS1 and Reception received free swimming lessons. That equates to over 2000 swimming sessions delivered across the school. All of the children passed swimming badges/certificates and all teachers report an increase in confidence and ability for all pupils across the 5 week sequence.

Equipment

Many new resources have been purchased for the school as a direct result of the increased PE funding. These purchases (on top of our normal 'buy' of tennis balls, etc.) include;

- 6 replacement basketball hoops and backboards.
- Netball bibs
- TAG rugby balls, belts and tags.
