Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to start by saying a well done to all our Year 6 pupils who have worked really hard on practice assessments in the hall this week in order to prepare them for Government tests coming up in May. Y6 teachers and I have been really impressed with their attitude and focus. There is a meeting for Year 6 parents and carers at 5pm next Tuesday.

Also this week, Year 1 had outdoor classroom on Tuesday where they looked for signs of Spring and made some transient artwork and Year 3 had outdoor classroom on Wednesday where they made fires and cooked marshmallows. On Tuesday some Year 5 and 6 children took part in the final Honiton Learning Community TAG rugby competition where they came in third place overall.

Yesterday we hosted another visit from our external school improvement partner. We explored together the provision for pupils across the school with special educational needs (SEN), observed learning behaviour in classrooms across the school twice and evaluated the quality of the Early Years provision in Nursery and Reception. The children we visited and spoke to were fantastic, we observed some amazing learning and it was an extremely positive visit.

Next week, as you know, we hope to have our whole school photograph on the field to mark the school's Golden Anniversary this month. Hopefully the weather will be kind to us!

Also next week, some of our children take part in the Devon gymnastics finals on Monday via zoom in the school hall. We have outdoor classrooms for Year 4 on Tuesday and Year 5 (3rd time lucky!) on Thursday. We also welcome Nursery parents to a stay and play session at 2:30pm on Thursday afternoon.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, on Thursday next week we are wearing bright rainbow colours to mark Autism Awareness Day which actually falls on 2nd April which is within the Easter holidays. We have many children on the autistic spectrum and I will speak about this in assembly with the help of some of these children as part of the day.

Next week, there will be a short newsletter on Thursday as there is no school on Friday as we start the Easter holidays.

Finally, my thanks to the PTFA for organising the bingo evening tonight. I look forward to seeing lots of you there!

Read Write Inc News

Next week marks the end of our Spring term of Read Write Inc in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. We are all really pleased with the progress that children are making and would like to thank parents and carers for supporting this scheme. It has been a joy seeing the children develop their confidence reading and writing and using their storyteller voice to ensure their reading is exciting to listen to.

We know the Easter break is often busy for a lot of families so in order to minimise the stress of losing books over the holidays we will be **collecting in all Read Write Inc reading books by Monday 25th March**. Please ensure Reading books are in book bags daily. The Littletown website has videos available for all Read Write Inc levels – please use these over the holidays if you would like to continue to support your child with their sounds and words.

Remember, due to funding from the English Hub our children have access to eBooks on Oxford Owl <u>https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/login?active-tab=students</u>. This allows your child to continue to read over the Easter. Your child came home with a login at Christmas - this should be in their Reading Record (if you have

lost your child's login please get in touch asap). All of the books they have read this term will be available to practise reading over the Easter, showing their family and friends their storyteller voice and how quick they are at using Fred in the Head!
